Orientation Program	Undergraduate: Orientation is mandatory. This multi-day orientation assists students with their academic, personal, social and cultural transition in the WashU and St. Louis Community. Orientation fees are approximately \$500/student. MBA: single day orientation. Students should plan to arrive on campus one week early in order to settle. It is recommended arrive a few days early to settle in.			

Nomination & Application	
Eligibility	All students nominated by the home university are expected to meet the following criteria: - Currently enrolled, full-time, degree seeking candidates of the home university - Meet sufficient English language requirements - Be in good-academic and disciplinary standing - Be currently enrolled at the home university the semester immediately prior to exchange, with an exception for mandatory military service - UG: have successfully completed at least two semesters prior to semester of exchange
English Language Requirements	In order to ensure academic success, all students must submit English proficiency. If approved by exchange coordinator, students may have their home institution submit a letter confirming adequate language proficiency levels. Otherwise, a current valid minimum score of an Accepted Standardized English Proficiency Test will need to be submitted. We will accept a high quality, color PDF of the official (not student results print out) test scores. TOEFL and IELTS are the most commonly accepted form of documentation. We will verify your scores and reserve the right to ask for the original forms and documentation. For more information on the official documentation required, please contact your program advisor.
Nomination	All students must be nominated by their home university to be considered as an international exchange applicant. Each nomination should include: - Full name as appears in Passport - Student E-mail address - Gender - Date of birth in DD-MM-YYYY format - Nationality - Student home address - Term of Exchange; Year of Exchange The application will require more information, however, please include the above information in the nomination email.
Student Application Process	Undergraduate, BSBA: Online: Students can access the application process and required documents online at the Olin Business School Incoming Exchange Program MBA: Please contact the Academic Advisor, FT MBA

Academic Information	
Prerequisites	Students should review the prerequisites for courses online and should have similar prerequisites in their home university.
Grading & Credit Information	Undergraduate: The normal workload of a FT undergraduate student is 15 credit hours (approximately 5 classes). Each student must enroll in at least 12 credit hours and no more than 18 credit hours, in accordance with home university approval. Grading Scale: http://bulletin.wustl.edu/undergrad/business/policies/ MBA: The normal workload of a FT MBA student is 12 credit hours.
Courses & Registration	Undergraduate: Once admitted, students will be asked advising to complete a saved schedule and work with their inbound exchange advisor. The inbound exchange advisor will register students prior to arrival. Upon arrival, students may add and drop courses within a specific time frame, provided there are seats remaining in the course of change. Immigration
Exchange students at Washington University are required to apply for a student visa (J-1) prior to arrival in the USA. Admission to the exchange program is conditional upon receipt of legal status for the duration of the program. Upon successful completion of the application for admission, the Olin Inbound Advisor will work with the Washington University Office of International Student & Scholars to provide documentation necessary in order for the student to apply for a visa, which includes a DS-2019 document. Upon receipt of the DS-2019, student should immediately schedule a visa appointment with the US consulate. Health Insurance
All exchange students are required by Student Health Services (SHS) to complete online forms, including medical & health history, immunizations, and meningitis information.
