Length of study:

The M.A. with Thesis is a two-year, four-semester program

The M.A. programs with specializations (without theses) are one-year, three-semester programs.

Admission Requirements:

B.A. degree in the Social Sciences (Political Science, Government, International Relations, Public Policy, Public Administration, Economics, Sociology, Psychology, Communications).

A grade of 88 or higher for the M.A. with Thesis program;

A grade of 80 or higher for the M.A. in Government with Specialization

Prerequisites:

Students who have not received a B.A. degree in the social sciences will be required to take an additional 8 hours of pre-requisite courses, in consultation with the head of the M.A. admissions committee. These courses must be completed by the end of the first semester.

About the Program

The specialization combines theory and practice of contemporary diplomacy and the study of conflict. Students will gain an understanding of how conflicts and wars develop and how they may be managed or resolved, strategically, diplomatically or informally. By gaining knowledge and tools, students will be equipped to deal with international conflicts and problems in today's globalized world. In addition to the psychological, cultural and legal aspects of conflict, the program emphasizes the acquisition of tools for dealing with conflict: negotiation, mediation, public diplomacy, post-conflict reconstruction, and track-two engagement. International intervention, third party involvement and peacekeeping will also be examined, with particular respect for their integration into the strategies of governmental and non-governmental bodies. Additional emphasis on Contemporary Middle East, aims to explore the region's transformation in pursuit of democracy, economic development, as well as its effects on forces born and bred in the region – Islamic fundamentalism, global Jihad and extreme modes of nationalism. It highlights the fact that regimes and the public now recognize unprecedented challenge of urgency for change, which touches almost every area of life in the Middle East.

About the Program

The M.A. Program with Specialization in Counter-Terrorism and Intelligence is offered by the Lauder School of Government, Diplomacy and Strategy in collaboration with the International Institute for Counter-Terrorism (ICT). The program enhances students' understanding of contemporary terrorism and intelligence challenges facing Israel and her allies, and equips students with conceptual, analytical, and practical tools to enhance the struggle against international terrorism. The program also addresses key dilemmas related to national and international security, particularly with respect to counter-terrorism and intelligence. The program harnesses Israel's deep experience with matters related to counter-terrorism and intelligence and features internationally renowned faculty from both Israel and abroad who combine relevant academic training with in-depth practical experience. The program incorporates state-of-the-art educational tools, including simulations, skill-building workshops, and field trips. Courses in the program are designed to familiarize students with a broad range of counter-terrorism tools, such as psychological, legal, military, and intelligence aspects of counter-terrorism. The program also hones students' understanding of best practices in intelligence collection, analysis, and dissemination, with the aim of bolstering security infrastructures to better address terrorism and other contemporary security challenges.

התמחות במדיניות ציבורית ושיווק פוליטי*

ראש ההתמחות: פרופ' משה מאור

אודות התכנית

תוכנית הלימודים M.A. בממשל, בהתמחות במדיניות ציבורית ושיווק פוליטי, הינה ייחודית לאוניברסיטת רייכמן והראשונה מסוגה בישראל. זוהי התמחות רב תחומית, עשירה ומקיפה שמטרתה להכשיר את בוגרי ובוגרות ההתמחות במדיניות ציבורית לקריירה באגפים אסטרטגיים במשרדי ממשלה, רשויות מקומיות, יחידות רגולטוריות, וארגוני הסקטור העסקי וההתנדבותי העובדים בממשק עם הסקטור הממשלתי, ואת בוגרי ובוגרות ההתמחות בשיווק פוליטי, לקריירה בזירה הפוליטית ולקריירה בייעוץ תקשורתי אסטרטגי, לובינג, קשרי ממשל, וניהול משברים.

התוכנית מקנה ידע וכלים לעיצוב, יישום ושיווק מדיניות ציבורית בחברה הטרוגנית ומשתנה, ולהטמעת השימוש בניתוח Big Data בתהליכי קבלת החלטות. הסטודנטים בתוכנית רוכשים את התשתית הנורמטיבית, הארגונית, התקציבית, והמכרזית הנדרשת להנעת רפורמות במנהל ומדיניות ציבורית, וכן כלים לניתוח נתונים ולקידום יוזמות ופרויקטים מבוססי נתונים בתחומי חדשנות מדיניות והערכות והתמודדות בחירום. הסטודנטים בהתמחות זו ירכשו את הכלים המסייעים לרשויות הממשל לפעול בזירה תקשורתית מורכבת, את הכלים המסייעים לגורמים עסקיים וחברתיים להשפיע על החלטות של רשויות השלטון, ואת ההשפעה שיש לנגישות למידע ולמעורבות הציבור בקביעת מדיניות על הדינמיקה של תהליך המדיניות. התכנית נועדה לתת מענה לצורך הגובר באנשי ונשות מקצוע שיכולים להתמודד עם אתגרים מורכבים בסביבה בה קיימת אי-וודאות רבה. ממוצע הציונים הנדרש בתואר ראשון הינו 80, והרקע של התלמידים והתלמידות מגוון, וכולל בין היתר לימודים במדעי החברה, מדעי הרוח, משפטים, מנהל עסקים, שמאות, אדריכלות, עבודה סוציאלית, הנדסה ומדעי המחשב.

About the Program

The M.A. program with Thesis at the Lauder School of Government, Diplomacy and Strategy prepares students for an academic career involving research and teaching. By the end of the first semester, students should have selected an advisor from the permanent faculty of the Lauder School of Government at Reichman University, to guide the M.A. student in preparing the thesis and to devise together a degree plan.

Length of Study

The M.A. with Thesis program is a two year, four-semester program (39 Credits for M.A with Thesis / 61 Credits for M.A. with Thesis with Specialization).

Exams and papers may be submitted in Hebrew or English, including the M.A. thesis. Approval of the thesis proposal and a grade point average of 80 are required to proceed to the second year of study.
