

Application and Admissions Regulations Undergraduate Degrees 2026-27

[Reichman University](#) is much more than just a place to study. Come and discover it for yourself!

Below, you will find detailed information on the Raphael Recanati International School's application process and admissions regulations. In addition, our [Recruitment & Admissions Department](#) is always available to answer your questions.

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1. Application Period

- a) Regular Application period: November 1st, 2025 – July 15th, 2026.
- b) An interested individual will be considered a candidate for studies at Reichman University only once they have submitted to Reichman University all required information, grades, and documents necessary for registration. Only at this stage will their candidacy be reviewed according to the admission requirements. All forms and documents must be submitted to the Raphael Recanati International School Admissions Office **by July 15, 2026**.
- c) **Applications submitted after the deadline will be reviewed based on availability, and admission will be subject to compliance with the admissions requirements** as well as the approval of the admissions committee. Applicants who apply after the deadline may also be placed on a waiting list.
- d) **Depending on availability, some programs may fill up before the deadline. Accordingly, Reichman university reserves the right to place applicants on the waiting list before July 15th, 2026.**
- e) The 2026-27 academic year is scheduled to open on October 18, 2026.
- f) Orientation Week, which is mandatory for first-year undergraduate students, begins on October 11, 2026.

2. Undergraduate Programs

- It is not possible to apply to more than one program at a time. When applying, a candidate is applying to a specific degree program and not to the RRIS as a whole.
- There are several programs within each of the Reichman University Schools and their admissions criteria may differ.

- Students, who decide to apply to a program after they already submitted an application for a different one, are required to notify the admissions coordinator in writing. Admission will be based on availability and the admissions criteria for that program.
- The number of available spots after the admissions deadline is limited, and Reichman University reserves the right to impose stricter criteria on applicants who apply after the deadline or on applicants who submit any required information, transcripts, or documents during that period.

3. Application Process

When applying to one of the RRIS undergraduate programs, applicants must submit the following:

I. **Application form and fees**

There is a non-refundable application fee of \$100 USD, which covers the cost of processing and evaluating the application. This fee is non-refundable, even if an applicant decides to withdraw their application.

II. **A scanned copy of an Israeli ID card or an international passport**

III. **High school/University grades**

- a) Applicants must submit official copies of their transcripts and diplomas. Applicants in their final year of high school may submit partial transcripts. Acceptance of these applicants is contingent upon receipt of final transcripts that show they graduated high school and that their final grades are similar to those earned in previous semesters.

Applicants who have completed at least 30 credits at university or community college may submit those transcripts in lieu of high school transcripts and a standardized test.

Applicants applying to quantitative degree programs will still need to submit their high school transcripts, even if they completed 30 or more university/college credits.

- b) **Applicants with an Israeli Bagrut:** Reichman University candidates must be eligible for a Bagrut certificate (this is not the case for candidates who already have an academic degree, or for candidates over the age of 30, who must supply their eligibility only if requested).

The Bagrut exam results of candidates who graduated high school from 1990 onwards will be transferred directly from the Israeli Ministry of Education to Reichman University. Therefore, when applying, candidates will be asked to sign a Bagrut authorization form and to submit a copy of their Bagrut Certificate.

Candidates whose Bagrut eligibility is subject to summer exams can only be evaluated after the RRIS Admissions Office receives those exam grades from the candidates themselves, or from their high school. They can, however, be accepted, on condition that Reichman University receives their official grades from the Israeli Ministry of Education before the academic year begins.

Candidates who wish to improve or complete a Bagrut exam during the course of the application year must note this in the relevant place on the application form, as well as inform the admissions coordinator. Their candidacy will be reviewed based on their official Bagrut grades to date. Once Reichman University receives the updated Bagrut grades, their candidacy can be reassessed.

IV. Recommendations

Applicants must submit two letters of recommendation from individuals who can assess their strengths, capabilities, and academic abilities. Evaluators can be teachers, educators, counselors, employers, or supervisors. The recommendation letters can be in either English or Hebrew and must be submitted directly by the recommender to the appropriate Admissions Coordinator or to rris.registrar@runi.ac.il. E-mails with the recommendation letters should include the name of the applicant and program they are applying to.

V. Essay

Applicants are required to write a 250-500-word essay in English, explaining why they would like to study in Israel at Reichman University, and why they chose the particular academic program for which they are applying. The essay should be uploaded to the online registration form.

VI. Curriculum Vitae /Resume

Applicants are required to submit a CV (in English) detailing their educational history, volunteering, youth groups, army history (if applicable), and any employment details (if applicable). This should also be uploaded to the online registration form. Please make sure to place the applicants' full name at the top of the CV and that it is in a professional CV format.

VII. English Proficiency Exams

The academic curriculum of the Raphael Recanati International School is taught entirely in English. Graduates of high schools in which English was not the primary language of instruction are required to pass an English Proficiency Exam. If available, the exam results should also be uploaded to the online registration form. The admissions office will place the applicant according to their English score. There are four different English levels. Depending on their level, students may be required to attend English classes during their first year:

- **Exemption** – Students are exempt from any further English proficiency requirements.
- **Advanced II** – Students are required to take and pass one English proficiency course during their first year at Reichman University.

- **Advanced I+II** – Students are required to take and pass two English proficiency courses during their first year at Reichman University.
- **English Mechina (Preparatory Course)** – Students are required to take part in and successfully pass the Reichman University English preparatory summer course prior to the start of the academic year, as well as two English proficiency courses during their first year.

Amirnet Exam

The Amirnet English exam is an online exam intended to test the student's English proficiency and is given by the National Institute for Testing and Evaluation (NITE).

Anyone interested in taking the AMIRNET may register for the test on the NITE website. Tests for those who register via the site will be administered at one of the NITE Test Centers across Israel.

The exam score will be reported directly to the chosen academic institution upon registration for the exam.

*Students must wait at least 35 days between the two English proficiency level exams.

Testing Policy & Quantitative Requirements

Reichman University is **test-optional** for students graduating from U.S. high schools. While we generally recommend submitting SAT or ACT scores to highlight your mathematical proficiency, they are not a mandatory requirement for most programs, and applicants will not be disadvantaged by their absence.

Please note the following exceptions and recommendations:

- **Computer Science Applicants:** Submission of a standardized test (SAT or ACT) is **required** for all candidates applying to the Computer Science program.
- **U.S. High School Graduates:** Applicants whose high school math grades do not meet our minimum threshold are **required** to submit SAT or ACT scores to demonstrate their quantitative readiness.
- **International Applicants (Non-U.S.):** For candidates from all other countries, if your high school math grades do not meet our requirements, we **strongly recommend** taking the SAT or ACT. Submitting a strong quantitative score is an excellent way to improve your academic profile and increase your chances of acceptance.
- **Exemption for Transfer Students:** Standardized tests are waived for any applicant who has successfully completed at least one year of university-level studies with honors or distinction.

- f) Students who graduated from a high school in Israel may take the Psychometric exam (but are not required to).

Results of the Psychometric exams are valid for ten years after the exam date. Candidates who have applied and will be taking the Psychometric exam are to request, when registering for the exam, that their results be transferred to Reichman University. The results of the Psychometric exam will be received directly from the National Institute for Testing and Evaluation. Candidates who took the exam in the past and did not request to transfer their results directly to Reichman University are required to contact the National Institute for Testing and Evaluation and request that they do so.

* Standardized tests or Psychometric exam results published on the relevant websites cannot be treated as an original statement of grades.

Once an application is received and processed by the RRIS Admissions Department, the candidate will receive an e-mail confirming the receipt of their application. Should any further documents be needed, the candidate will receive a detailed e-mail from the admissions officer listing the documents that must be provided.

4. Admissions Process

- a) Admission to a program is based on the level of the candidate's achievements.
- b) The RRIS Admissions Committee reserves the right to grant some preference in admissions decisions and to invite candidates for a personal interview.
- c) It is not possible to apply to more than one program. If a candidate does not meet the threshold of the program to which they are applying, they will be offered other options by the admissions coordinator without the need to reapply.
- d) Applicants who are accepted must complete the application process, including payment of a tuition deposit, within the specified time limit, following notification of acceptance. Paying the deposit is a commitment to studying at Reichman University in the coming academic year and to complying with the tuition regulations.

5. Evaluation of Credits Previously taken

The process of evaluation of credits can only be done after the applicant has confirmed their studies at Reichman University, by paying the \$1,050 confirmation fee.

Applicants who have previously studied courses in an accredited academic institution, and would like to formally have their credits evaluated and possibly transferred to Reichman University, are welcome to contact the RRIS Student Administration, through their candidate info station, submit their official transcripts and course syllabi, which will then be assessed by the relevant academic staff.

The final decision is that of the academic head of program, based on the final grade attained in the course as well as the course material. Some or all of the credits may not be transferred to Reichman University.

Having credits transferred to Reichman University will not necessarily shorten the time period required for the degree, which will most likely still take 3 years to complete.

6. Preparatory Courses¹

The RRIS curriculum includes preparatory courses prior to the beginning of the academic year, designed to teach new students various skills that will be necessary to succeed in their studies. For the Preparatory Courses Schedule, see [here](#).

Preparatory Math Course for Business

Length of the course: 90 academic hours (17 sessions)

Course Dates: August 2, 2026 - September 3, 2026.

Exam Date: September 9, 2026, 09:45AM ON CAMPUS

Applicants who have been admitted to the BA program in Business Administration; the double major program in Business Administration and Economics; the double major program in Entrepreneurship and Business; the double major in Economics and Entrepreneurship with Data Science, are required to participate in a mathematics preparatory course. Applicants are required to refer to their acceptance letter to determine if they are required to participate in this course.

Course topics:

- Basic algebraic operations
- Algebraic identities
- Solving equations and inequalities
- Linear and quadratic functions
- The Cartesian coordinate system (the xy-plane)
- Logarithms and exponents: Basic techniques and equations
- Differentiation techniques and applications of the derivative
- Limits of functions

- Graphing functions
- Arithmetic and geometric sequences

We strongly recommend that students review the subjects listed above as some previous knowledge is assumed in these subjects.

Online Mathematics Refresher Course for Computer Science (On ZOOM)

Length of the course: 36 academic hours (6 sessions)

Course Dates: June 29, 2026, to July 15, 2026, via ZOOM.

We offer our applicants an online refresher course to bridge the gap between their high school mathematics and university mathematics. All applicants who have been admitted to the BSc in Computer Science or the double major in Entrepreneurship and Computer Science program, are required to participate on the refresher course.

Course topics:

- Basic algebra equations
- Arithmetic sequences
- Geometric sequences
- Trigonometric identities
- Functions

Preparatory Math Course for Computer Science (ON CAMPUS)

Length of the course: 100 academic hours (17 sessions)

Course Dates: July 26, 2026 – August 31, 2026.

Exam dates²: First Session: September 2, 2026, 9:45AM ON CAMPUS.

Second Session: September 9, 2026, 9:45 ON CAMPUS.

Applicants who have been admitted to the BSc program in Computer Science or the Double Major program in Entrepreneurship & Computer Science, are required to pass a Mathematics preparatory course for Computer Science. Applicants are required to refer to their acceptance letter to determine if they are required to pass this course in order to officially enroll in the School of Computer Science.

Course topics:

- **Equations of one or two variables**
- **Linear equations**
- **Quadratic equations**
- **Equation of a higher degree**

² There are only two exam sessions for the Computer Science Math Preparatory Course. A third exam session will not be given, under no circumstances.

- **Equations with parameters**
- **Equations with radicals**
- Polynomial division
- **Inequalities (linear, quadratic, higher degree, with quotients, with absolute value, “and/or” systems)**
- **Exponents and logarithms (properties, equations and inequalities)**
- **Basic functions: Linear and quadratic**
- Sequences (arithmetic, geometric, recursive)
- Complex numbers
- Limits
- Derivatives (definition, application)
- Function investigation: Polynomials; Rational functions; Radicals; Exponential and logarithmic functions including parametric problems
- Trigonometric identities and equations

Preparatory Programming Course (On Campus)

Length of the course: 40 academic hours (10 sessions)

Course dates: July 26, 2026 – August 18, 2026.

No Exam

The purpose of the course is to provide participants with basic programming skills and to prepare them for the course “Introduction to Computer Science,” which is offered in the Fall semester. This preparatory course is an introductory course that requires no prior knowledge or background in programming, but the fundamental topics are studied at a fast pace. Participation in the course is mandatory.

Course topics:

- Basic data types
- Variables
- Logic and arithmetic expressions
- Control structures (if, while, for)
- One-dimensional arrays
- Writing, documentation, and testing computer programs in Java

Preparatory English Course

Length of the course: 33 academic hours (11 sessions)

Course Dates: August 10, 2026 - August 31, 2026.

Exam Date: September 1, 2026, at 09:45 PM ON CAMPUS.

Based on previous studies and level of English proficiency (demonstrated on an English proficiency exam), candidates may be required to participate in an English language preparatory course (English Mechina). This course is designed to prepare non-native speakers for academic studies in English. Please refer to your acceptance letter to determine whether you are required to participate in this course.

7. Special Admissions Categories

Previous Academic Studies

Candidates with previous academic studies from an institution recognized by the Council of Higher Education must provide an original and official transcript, including a final grade point average. Candidates who hold an academic degree must also provide an original diploma attesting to eligibility for a degree.

Age 30+

According to the decision of the Council of Higher Education (CHE), individuals over the age of 30 may apply for studies without graduation eligibility and without a Psychometric exam grade. These candidates are required to demonstrate that they have an impressive and suitable background. The Admissions Committee is responsible for the decision regarding their admissions, which will be in accordance with CHE instructions.

8. Learning disabilities, statements of disability, students with disabilities and receiving accessibility accommodations

Learning disabilities / attention deficit disorders

Reasonable accommodations are provided by Reichman University for students who have been diagnosed with learning disabilities or attention deficit disorder.

Students who want the University to recognize their learning disabilities and be eligible for exam accommodations are required to submit appropriate documents to support their requests.

Students who have completed **high school in Israel** and did regular Bagrut exams (without special accommodations for new immigrants), even if they are studying in the international program, must take a specific standardized test called Matal מ"ל. For **international students who have completed high school outside of Israel**: Please carefully read the procedure for applying for exam accommodations for learning disabilities and/or ADHD on the [Dean of Student Affairs](#) website.

Students who apply for exam accommodations no later than 5 weeks before the end of a semester will be able to receive accommodations for that semester's exams. Applications submitted after this time will be processed in accordance with the University's time constraints.

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Tuition Payment Arrangements

In order to reserve a place in the class, a \$1,050 tuition down payment must be paid according to the instructions specified in the acceptance letter. The down payment is the first annual tuition payment.

Before the beginning of the academic year, each student will receive information regarding tuition payment options beyond the initial deposit (payment by credit card or bank transfer), according to the cash rate or installment plan.

10. Scholarships or Other Funding Sources

Students who are considered new immigrants must update the Student Authority with their academic status in order to receive the Student Authority ("Minhal HaStudentim") grant. Should a student receive any scholarship, grant or other form of funding, he/she must contact the Reichman University Tuition Department in order to receive a revised payment plan.

Important Information

1. Reichman University reserves the right to make changes to all the above-mentioned terms and regulations, without personally notifying all those concerned.
2. Tuition rates and additional fees are subject to change by Reichman University at its discretion, any time prior to the beginning of studies.
3. Students who do not settle their payments for tuition, health insurance and dorms on time, will be limited in their access to their Moodle and their student information center.
4. For the avoidance of any doubt, the granting of an academic exemption from one or more courses shall not constitute grounds for any exemption, reduction, or refund of tuition fees.
5. A student shall be required to pay the minimum tuition applicable to the degree program, even if the degree is completed in a period shorter than the standard duration.

Additional Expenses

Students are responsible for their airfare to and from Israel; Tuition does not include the cost of textbooks.

Scholarships

Various scholarships and loan opportunities are available to students at the Raphael Recanati International School. Financial aid is awarded based on the candidate's background and/or status in Israel. For further information please visit our [Financial Aid and Scholarship website](#).

11. Laptop Requirement

By submitting an application, the applicant confirms that they are aware that, should they commence their studies as a student at the University, in order to meet the academic requirements, including participation in classes, completion of assignments, exercises, and examinations, they are expected to obtain and use a properly functioning laptop computer, in accordance with the University's recommendations as published from time to time.

The applicant understands that, if admitted and enrolled as a student at Reichman University, they are expected to bring their laptop to classes and examinations and to ensure that it is in proper working condition and ready for use, including the installation of required updates and software, as instructed by the University during the course of their studies. Upon becoming a student, they will be required to use their personal computer in accordance with the University's guidelines, including those relating to information security, data protection and privacy, copyright, and related matters.

12. Tuition Regulations for Students Who Terminate Their Studies

A student who has completed the formal registration process at Reichman University, including payment of the deposit, is considered a full student and their place is guaranteed.

However, in exceptional personal circumstances that prevent a student from fulfilling their commitment to begin studies in the academic year for which they registered, even after paying the deposit, it is possible to cancel enrollment by providing written notice (a phone call will NOT be considered as an official notification), in accordance with the procedure for notification of withdrawal from studies. The financial obligation will be determined according to the date the withdrawal notice is submitted (see the withdrawal table below).

Freezing of studies is treated as a **cessation of studies** initiated by a student and students are charged according to the termination of studies table above.

Notification of cancellation or freezing of studies at any date will result in the cancellation of the student's entitlement to a scholarship or discount, which will be cancelled retroactively.
