Dear students,

We are pleased to inform you that the latest guidelines that we received from the government last Friday allow us, immediately after the Passover holiday, to partially resume studies on our "green campus."

Thus, upon returning from the Passover holiday on April 5th, the campus will operate according to the following parameters:

First-year students and most second-year students in undergraduate programs will come to campus for a day of classes either once a week or once every two weeks. Individual instructions in this regard will be sent to you directly by the student administration office by the end of the week. The reasons for dividing the on-campus days between the different classes stem from the number of students in the original class and in the entire track, scheduling constraints, and limitations arising from government guidelines, which among other things require every class taught on campus to also be taught online and the maintaining of physical distance between students in the classroom.

Classes will be held in hybrid classrooms, which allow for the online participation of students who cannot be on campus. At this stage, physical attendance in class on campus is not mandatory.

Students in the graduate (master's degree) programs will continue to study in the same format as before the Passover holiday.

The rest of the students will continue to study online.

It is important for us to let you know that we share your desire to return to a normal study routine on campus as soon as possible. However, all campus activity is subject to the directives of the Israeli government, which change frequently and are sent to us for implementation at short notice. At this time, these guidelines allow only those with a Green Pass to come to campus. As mentioned, we will provide an online alternative in hybrid classrooms for those who are unable to come to campus. Classes will continue to be recorded.

According to the government's decision, these guidelines will be in effect until April 10th. We hope that the trend of improvement in morbidity that we are witnessing will soon lead to the further lifting of restrictions, which will allow us to expand our activities on campus.

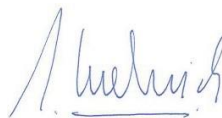

On the eve of Passover, we wish you a happy holiday, hoping that soon we will all experience complete freedom!

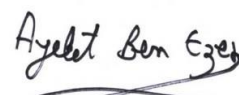
