

## Interdisciplinary Elective Courses

- Registration for interdisciplinary elective courses (courses from other schools on campus) is possible, conditional upon meeting the course prerequisites and vacancy in the course.
- Registration will be accomplished by applying to your academic coordinator at the Student Administration during the second week of the fall semester.

Please note:

**Hebrew is an Interdisciplinary Elective Course and not part of the General Studies Unit.**

- Hebrew Ulpan is a yearlong elective course providing 2 credits.
- During orientation week, a Hebrew language placement test will be given and students will be divided into four levels according to their knowledge of Hebrew.
- Students who took Hebrew Ulpan last year may continue this year at a higher level (without retaking the placement test) and receive 2 additional Interdisciplinary elective credits. Registration will be done via the internet during registration period.

## Community Service

As part of the Interdisciplinary Elective Courses, 2 credits will be given for voluntary activity within the community or at IDC. For further information please see the course description in the online handbook.

- Students can receive credits for performing community service **only once** during their studies. Students cannot "accumulate" credits for different community service projects in which they participated as part of their studies.

340      **Debate** - Debating provides practical tools, such as: public speaking skills; building a logical argument; developing skills of persuasion; and learning how to control a conversation. Only graduates of the academic 'Debate' course can join the club.

761      **Sport** - For more details see the chapter on the athletic programs in the IDC Regulations.

6009      **Dor 3 Gil 3** - A new and unique IDC student initiative, created by IDC students whose goal is to make new technology accessible to the Elderly population. Students who take part in this project will mentor an elderly person for a whole academic year during which time they will teach him computer software and a variety of useful sites like: Skype, Facebook, booking Doctor appointments, banks, etc.

The volunteer work will take place in 3 retirement homes in Herzelyia where each student will be assigned an elderly person and tutor him each week for an hour and a half. In addition, we will have 2 volunteer days during the year.

- 6046 **IDC Choir** - The IDC choir works with the courtesy of the Zimmerman family for the tenth year and is conducted by Mr. Michael Shani. The choir performs a wide variety of material, and appears at various events on campus. No experience required or prior knowledge in reading music notes.
- 6065 **"Derech Haetgar" Project** - "Derech Haetgar/ Hagalim" are centers for education and challenge Sport for youth in risk. In these Centers we are looking for students to help kids with their homework once a week. This centers are for boys only and its either personal coaching or group coaching (up to 3 kids in one group) .
- 6066 **The Performing Dance Company of the Herzelia Interdisciplinary Center (IDC)** was established more than a decade ago and is made up of students from all of the faculties and from the International School. The Company represents the IDC and performs at official events and ceremonies of the IDC and of the Student Union. In addition, there is cooperation with the City of Herzelia, festivals throughout Israel and also community charity events. Aya Mor Sasson is the Company's choreographer.
- 6096 **PUSH Project** - PUSH is a voluntary organization which operates good willing, educated volunteers who are prepared to tutor one or up to three children from an under privileged background once a week for one and a half hours within school premises.
- 6114 **The IDC Band** Established five years ago initiated by students at the Center. The band is intended for students with musical talent - musicians and singers alike. The band appears live in the Center events and student union events.
- 6115 **IDC Radio - 106.2 FM** - The students, who are the broadcasters, editors, producers, technicians and music editors, are supervised by a professional staff. The station operates 24/7, offering a wide range of programs in Hebrew and English.
- 6142 **Study Skills Center** - The Lea and Naftali Ben Yehuda Study Skills Center is designed to help students with learning disabilities and/or Attention Deficit Disorders to improve their study skills.
- 6226 **United Hatzalah** - United Hatzalah was established in 2006. The organization boasts more than 2000 volunteers active throughout Israel, all of whom are trained and certified as EMTs, paramedics or doctors. It is certified by Israeli health authorities to serve as an auxiliary organization for emergencies. United Hatzalah volunteers offer the ill and the injured medical assistance and emergency treatment.
- 6673 **Writing Center** - Students accepted to this program will be trained as writing center tutors and expected to provide 60 academic hours, in clinic hours and/or pre-scheduled meetings, assisting students in exchange for 2 academic credits. The Writing Center offers free services to all IDC students, and aims to provide students with help in all aspects of writing, including developing ideas, grammar, organization, style, argumentation and citation methods. The opportunity to become a tutor is open to students from the second year upwards, from all the academic schools, and of all nationalities.
- 6711 **Israeli Students Combating Antisemitism (ISCA) Project** allows students to take an active part against online anti-Semitism, racism and holocaust denial. The students are distributed to various teams working on the most popular platforms on the web (Facebook, Twitter, Wikipedia, Youtube etc') while receiving the freedom of choosing

how to tackle anti-Semitic material and how to spread knowledge condemning it. The project grants a unique opportunity to those who wish to fight both the ongoing racism directed towards Jews and de-legitimization of the state of Israel as a democratic state within the heart of the online community.

6712 **Remember and Honor** - The program is comprised of two parts: 1- volunteering with Holocaust Survivors and 2- group study in order to examine the important topics in this field. The group meets and engages in dialogue about different topics such as Holocaust remembrance in Israeli society, collective Jewish Identity and memory. Participants are very active and take part in the team which produces the annual "Holocaust Memorial Week" on campus and meet with other students from around the country.
