- Grade point average of 80 and above
- No disciplinary record at Reichman University
- Enrolled in RU as a full-time student (either Israeli or RRIS)
- Successful completion of “**Advanced English B**” is **mandatory** before applying

Timing

- RU students can only go on exchange during **Fall Semester**
- The academic semester often begins between August and October and lasts through December to March
- Make sure to check the academic calendar of each university abroad
- Jewish Holidays & Fridays



Tuition, Fees & Other Expenses

Tuition payment at partner institutions is waived for RU exchange students.

Exchange students will be responsible for their own expenses as followed:

- Flights
- Medical & travel insurance
- Visa
- Housing/accommodations
- Books etc.
- Other misc. costs (i.e., “Study Abroad Fee”) while abroad



It is the student's responsibility to research the various fees at the partner institutions.

Coursework

- Students can enroll for credit in courses available for exchange students, subject to prerequisites, capacity limitations and availability
- RU students will get full credit for all courses they complete successfully, subject to their academic advisor's approval
- Students who complete an extra semester abroad may still graduate on time and take part in the graduation ceremony, subject to successful completion of their courses abroad
- Studying abroad on a pass/fail basis

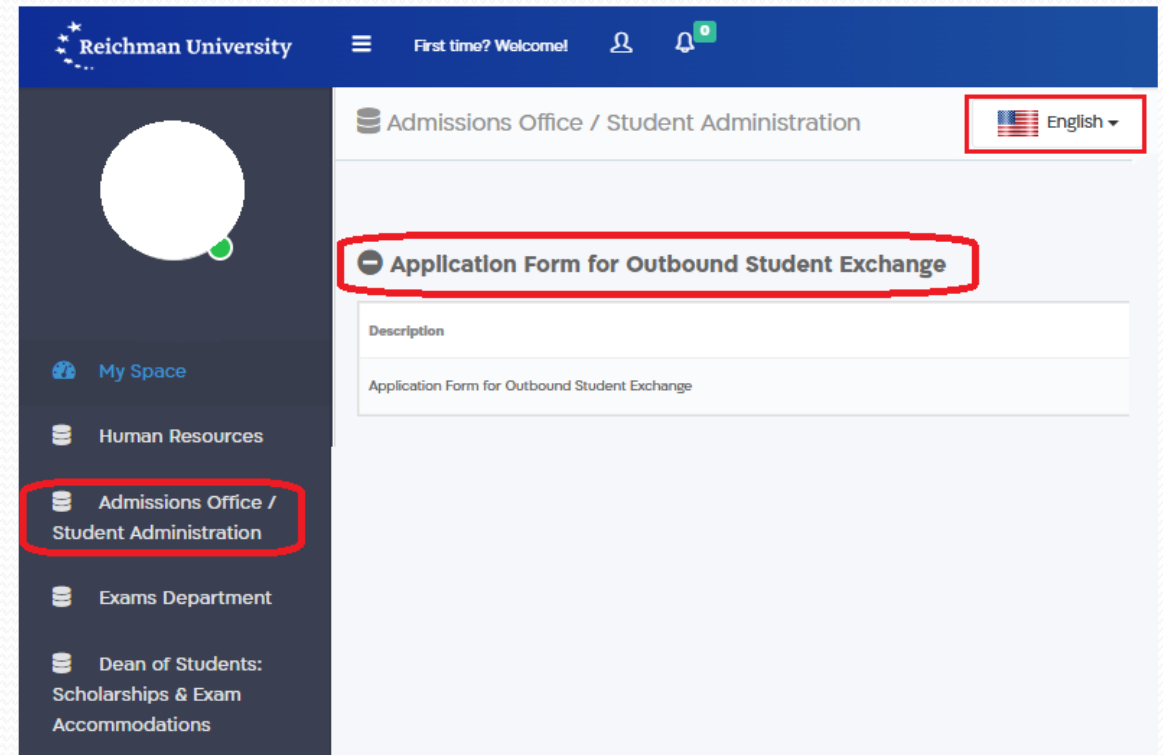

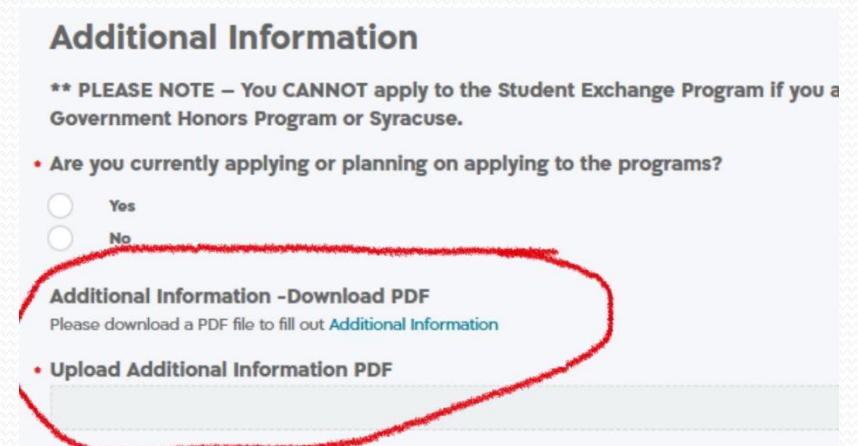

How to Research & Choose 3 Universities?

- Enter **Partner Table** on the RU website
- Open RELEVENT university page
- Read the **Factsheet & Partner Info** carefully
- Compare:
 - Courses
 - Costs
 - Housing
 - Language
 - Location
- You need to choose **3 eligible options**
⚠ You can be accepted to **only ONE**

Erasmus+ Scholarships

- Erasmus+ Scholarships (Europe Only)

*Support living and travel expenses:

approx. 800 Euro multiplied by the number of months in a semester + travel expenses of approx. 360 Euro

- Scholarship granted by the Partner's University
- Based on RU & the Partner's University financial criteria
- The funds will only be granted upon the student's arrival at the host university





SciencesPo.

Sciences Po

- Important Special Case: Sciences Po (France)
- 7 campuses across France
- You cannot choose Paris directly
- You apply to the network, they decide your city



- ▶ Please refrain from contacting the host institution until you have been accepted for exchange at RU and been given a 'green light' by us.

- ▶ **Things to consider:**

- **Cost:** Even though you are paying tuition directly to RU, you are responsible for the cost of food, travel, accommodations, insurance, and all other fees associated with living abroad.
- **Housing:** On-campus housing is available at some institutions at an additional cost; at others, students are responsible for finding their own accommodations.
- **Courses:** Courses must be approved by your academic advisor and coordinator at RU. In some schools it means forgoing Specialization/Clusters. Contact your academic coordinator.
- **Language:** Consider how easy/hard it will be to get around without knowing the local language.
- **Consider your mental preparedness for life in another country:**
While studying abroad may be the experience of a lifetime, keep in mind that living in another country is very different from travelling in it. Things might be different than what you are used to at home.
