

Dr. Yitzhak Trachtengot

Dr. Yitzhak Trachtengot is a Research Fellow at the Aaron Institute for Economic Policy at Reichman University, a Research Fellow at the Truman Institute for the Advancement of Peace at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, and a Postdoctoral Researcher in the Department of Psychology at the Hebrew University. He earned his Ph.D. from the Hebrew University in 2021. His doctoral dissertation examined the concept of *Minority Awareness* among minority populations in Israel.

Dr. Trachtengot heads the *Tzavta* program for Haredi students at the Hebrew University and the Dean's Program for Outstanding Haredi Ph.D. candidates. In addition, he serves as Head of the *Kadma* Program and Head of the Jewish Education Track at Herzog Academic College. Previously, he held a variety of managerial positions in the public sector, including roles at the Prime Minister's Office, the Joint Distribution Committee (JDC), the Jerusalem Municipality, and the Israel Association of Community Centers.

His research interests include multiculturalism, acculturation, majority–minority relations, and educational aspects of diverse cultures.

Dr. Trachtengot lives in Jerusalem with his wife, Sarah, and their seven children.
