




The Latest: Macron calls US exit from Iran deal a 'mistake'

A former top official in the George W. Bush administration says President Donald Trump's decision to leave the Iran nuclear deal bodes well for future talks with North Korea.

Elliot Abrams, the deputy national security adviser under Bush, says Wednesday the "effect on North Korea is salutary in that it suggests the president is true to his rhetoric — he is not going to accept a very bad deal."

Speaking on the sidelines of the Herzliya Conference, an annual security gathering north of Tel Aviv, Abrams says that staying in the deal would have sent a negative message that the Americans would buckle under the international pressure to abide by the 2015 deal. He says Trump was strengthening his hand for his upcoming summit with North Korean leader Kim Jong-Un.



Netanyahu opposition to Iran deal not shared by all Israelis

Shortly before Trump's announcement, the former head of Israel's Mossad spy agency said Iran is "fully complying with the nuclear deal." Tamir Pardo told a security conference in the coastal town of Herzliya there "still will be a need for some kind of deal at the end of the day."

"An American announcement that it's withdrawing from the agreement would let Iran drive a wedge between the world powers and gradually loosen international oversight over its nuclear program," Amos Gilad, a retired senior Israeli defense official, told the Haaretz newspaper for a story published this week.

"If the Americans abandon the agreement, they have to prepare for alternatives, and I don't see this being done," he said.

Gilad said Israel needs to prioritize the threats it faces.



Iranian forces fire rockets at Israeli military in first direct attack ever, Israel's army says

"Iran will retaliate through proxies, sooner or later, against Israeli military sites in the north," Gary Samore, a former White House coordinator for arms control and weapons of mass destruction, said at a security conference in Herzliya, Israel.

But he said that no side is interested in a full-scale conflict, and there is debate in Iran over how to proceed. He said Iranian President Hassan Rouhani wants to avoid confrontation because he is trying to preserve the nuclear deal with world powers. But Iranian military commanders want to retaliate for the death of Iranian soldiers.

Netanyahu to meet Putin amid new round of Syria strikes

Amos Gilad, a retired senior Israeli defense official, told a security conference in the coastal town of Herzliya that Iran's intentions in Syria meant a wider conflagration may only be a matter of time.

"They want to build a second Hezbollah-stan," he said, referring to the Iranian-backed Lebanese Shiite militant group that last fought a war with Israel in 2006. "They are determined to do it and we are determined to prevent it. It means we are on a collision course."

Israel's defense minister says the military has struck "nearly all" of the Iranian infrastructure sites in Syria.

Avigdor Lieberman says Thursday Israel responded fiercely to an unprecedented rocket attack by Iranian forces in Syria against Israel. He says no one was harmed in Israel and all the rockets were either intercepted or fell short. Lieberman told the Herzliya Conference, an annual security gathering north of Tel Aviv, that "if it rains on us it will be a flood on them."

Israel attacked dozens of Iranian targets overnight in response to the rocket barrage on Israeli positions in the Golan Heights. It was the most serious military confrontation between Israel and Iran to date and Israel's biggest strike in Syria since the 1973 war.

"We have hit almost all of the Iranian infrastructure in Syria. They must remember that if it rains here (in Israel) it will pour there," Israeli Defence Minister Avigdor Lieberman said.

Israel said the strikes were in response to Iranian forces firing 20 rockets at Israeli positions in the Golan Heights.

"Iranian missiles did not reach Israeli territory, they either fell in Syria or was intercepted by Iron Dome (missile defence system)" Lieberman said at a security conference in Herzliya, north of Tel Aviv.

Iranian officials have yet to comment on the Israeli claims.

As deal with Palestinians remains unlikely, Israel should defend its own interests, says former Shin Bet head

(May 10, 2018 / JNS) In the absence of a realistic opportunity to reach a peace deal with the Palestinian Authority in the coming years, Israel should begin formulating its own policies on how to defend its interests, the former chief of the Israel Security Agency (Shin Bet) Yoram Cohen told the Annual Herzliya Conference.

Cohen said that both sides of the debate on whether Israel should remain in the territories or vacate them advocate scenarios that carry significant risks. "Our dilemma is complex and fateful," he said. "Any policy we adopt will have significant risks."

Netanyahu's 'Iran doctrine' sidelines everything else

A few hours before Trump's declaration, several leaders of the political establishment who see themselves as Netanyahu's successors appeared at the annual Herzliya Conference — an important forum on policy and strategic issues. They of course devoted time to the nuclear deal. Without exception, chairman of Kulanu and Finance Minister Moshe Kahlon, chairman of HaBayit HaYehudi and Education Minister Naftali Bennett and chairman of the Knesset Yuli Edelstein all sided with the withdrawal from the agreement.

Bennett estimated that the ayatollah regime is on borrowed time and is bound to collapse, and he threatened Hezbollah Secretary-General Hassan Nasrallah by saying Nasrallah would lose Lebanon if the Hezbollah leader starts a war against Israel. Kahlon was the only one that day who, along with remarks on the bad deal between Iran and the powers, spoke about the Palestinians, but even he didn't give the issue priority and only said that we should wait for Trump's plan.



Ruckus Over RSVPs to Embassy Opening

The Israeli leftist party Meretz, which was not invited to either event, declared its conscientious objector status on Thursday. Meretz leader Tamar Zandberg said she could not support for such a "unilateral move" that could jeopardize the peace process.

The President's Speech and the Prospects of an Iranian-Israeli War

The evening US President Donald J. Trump took the United States out of Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), it smelled in Israel as if war was coming. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu cut short a trip to Cyprus. His Chief of Staff canceled his speech in the prestigious Herzliya conference. A few minutes before President Trump began his remarks, the Israel Defense Forces ordered residents of the Golan Heights (a northern region bordering Syria to brace for a possible attack from Syria, due to "abnormal movements of Iranian forces in Syria." CNN reported that American officials had similar concerns and the State Department issued a travel advisory for the Golan Heights.

Finally, it seems that the speech tilted the internal balance in Israel (and perhaps in the US) in favor of populist elected politicians, and away from cautious national security officials. The national security establishment seeme to prefer that the JCPOA be preserved. Just before the President's speech, General (Ret.) Amos Gilad, a former senior intelligence officer and senior ministry of defense official, stated that, without a clear alternative, the JCPOA should be kept. President Reuven Rivlin meanwhile called Iran "the greatest threat to world peace" and said its leadership had a "monstrous plan to wreak havoc, death and destruction."

Rivlin spoke Thursday evening at the annual Herzliya Conference, saying that Tehran's nuclear program and its regional ambitions in the Middle East cannot be separated since they are both "part of a monstrous plan by the Iranian leadership designed to wreak havoc, death, and destruction in the region and around the world. We expect our friends to stand with us in the fight against this danger."

"We are faced with an ongoing conflict with the Iranian regime," Rivlin added. "The Islamic Republic of Iran... is the greatest threat to world peace in general, and particularly in the Middle East and Israel."

Analysis: Iran deal withdrawal will make Israel less safe and war more likely

Speaking in Israel at the annual Herzliya Conference, former Mossad chief Tamir Pardo told the audience of policymakers that "Iran is fully complying" with the requirements of the deal, adding: "There still will be a need for some kind of deal at the end of the day."

Pardo, who headed Israel's foreign intelligence agency from 2011-16, during the height of concerns over Iran's nuclear programme, spoke alongside two former Israeli defence ministers – Lt. Gen. Moshe (Bogie) Ya'alon and Prof. Moshe Arens.

Only hours before large explosions were being reported in Syria on Tuesday night, as Israel braced for retaliatory action, Arens said: "Action we take against Iranian targets in Syria could trigger war."
