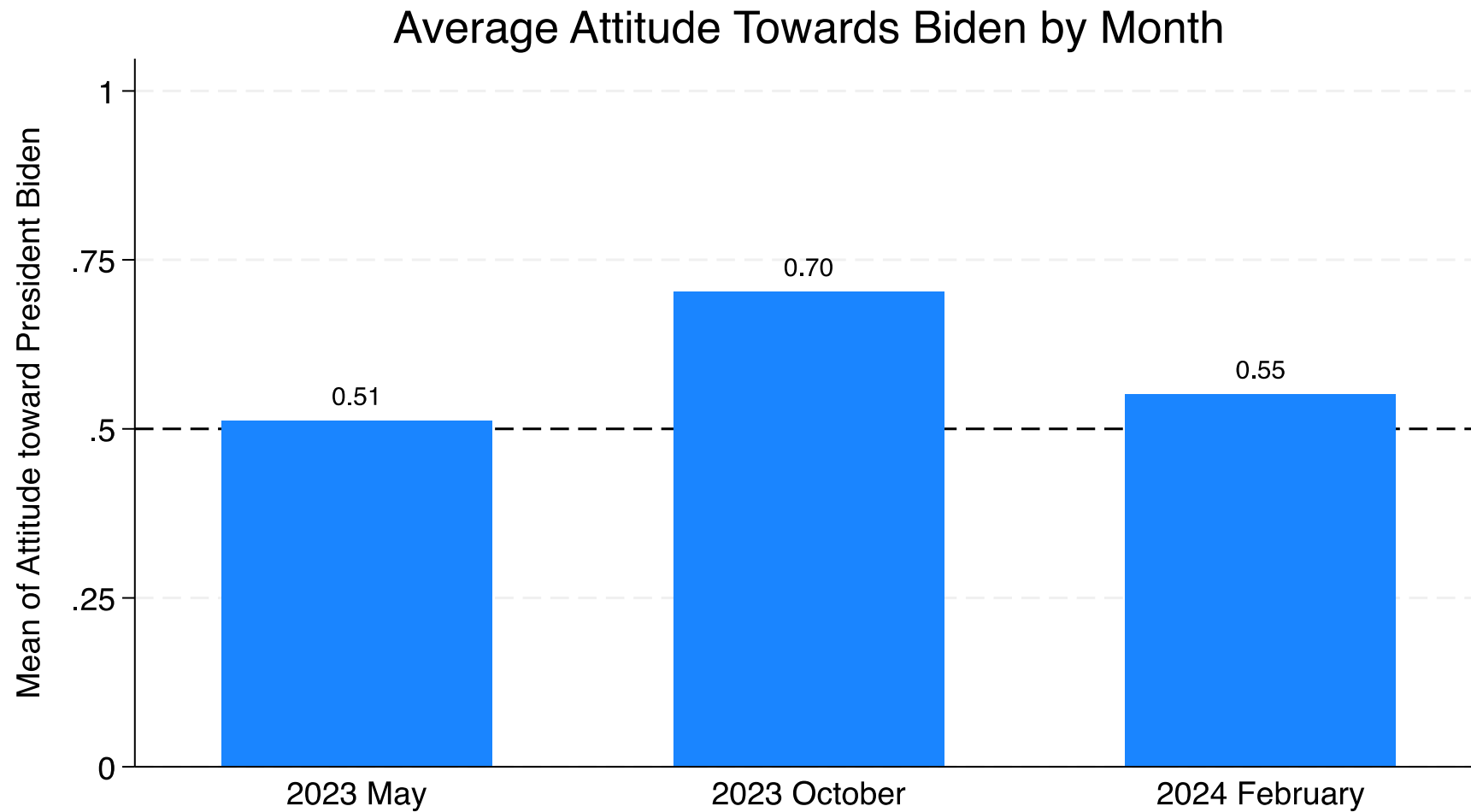

Methodology

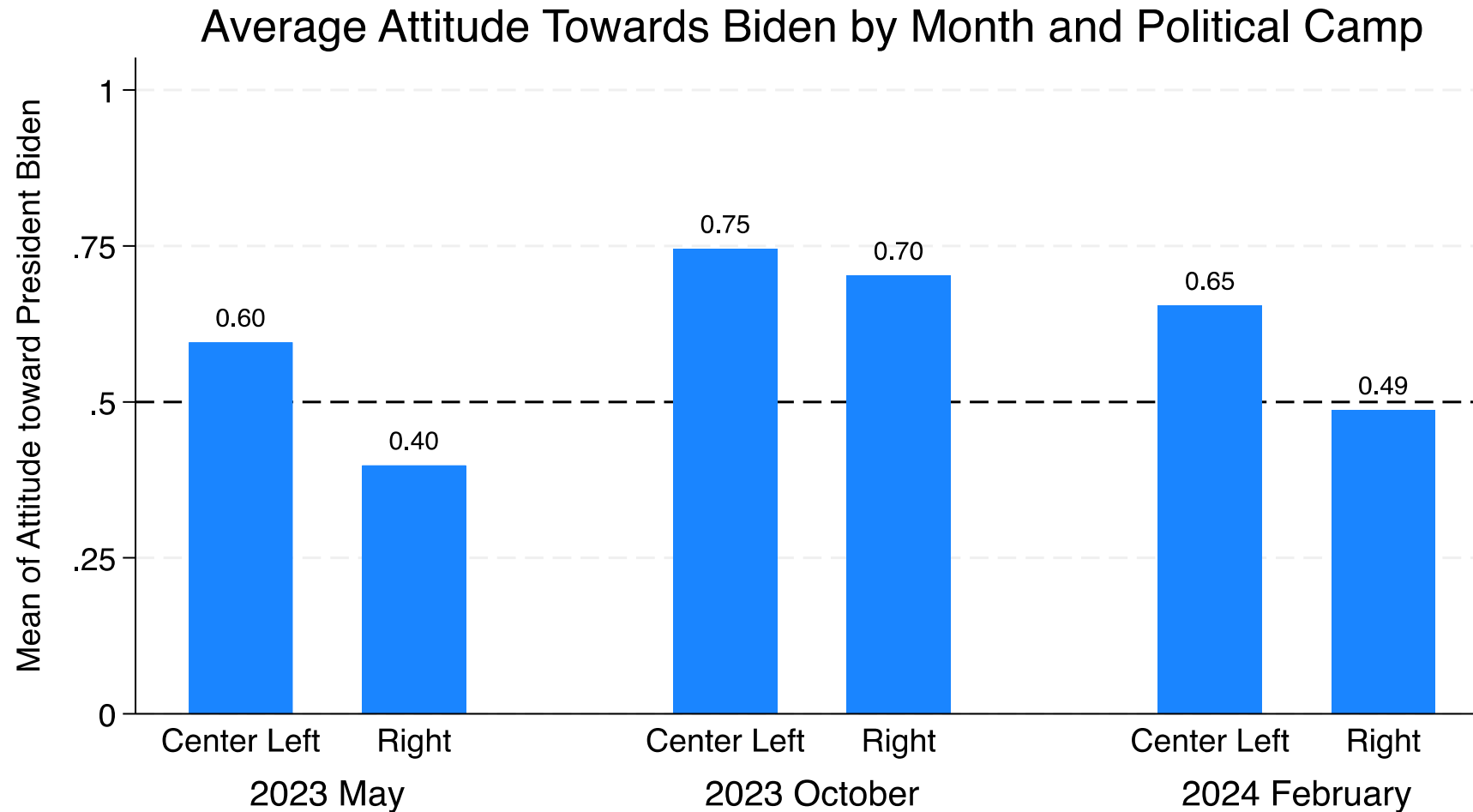
- The presentation is based on five surveys conducted by the Institute for Liberty and Responsibility using iPanel
 - May 2023, LibRes Values Survey, N=1514
 - October 2023, LibRes Recurring Survey, N=807
 - February 2024, LibRes Recurring Survey, N=803
 - September 2024, LibRes War Survey, N=1001
 - October 2024, LibRes Recurring Survey, N=803
- All samples are representative of the Israeli adult population.

The bump in support for Biden following October 7 soon receded



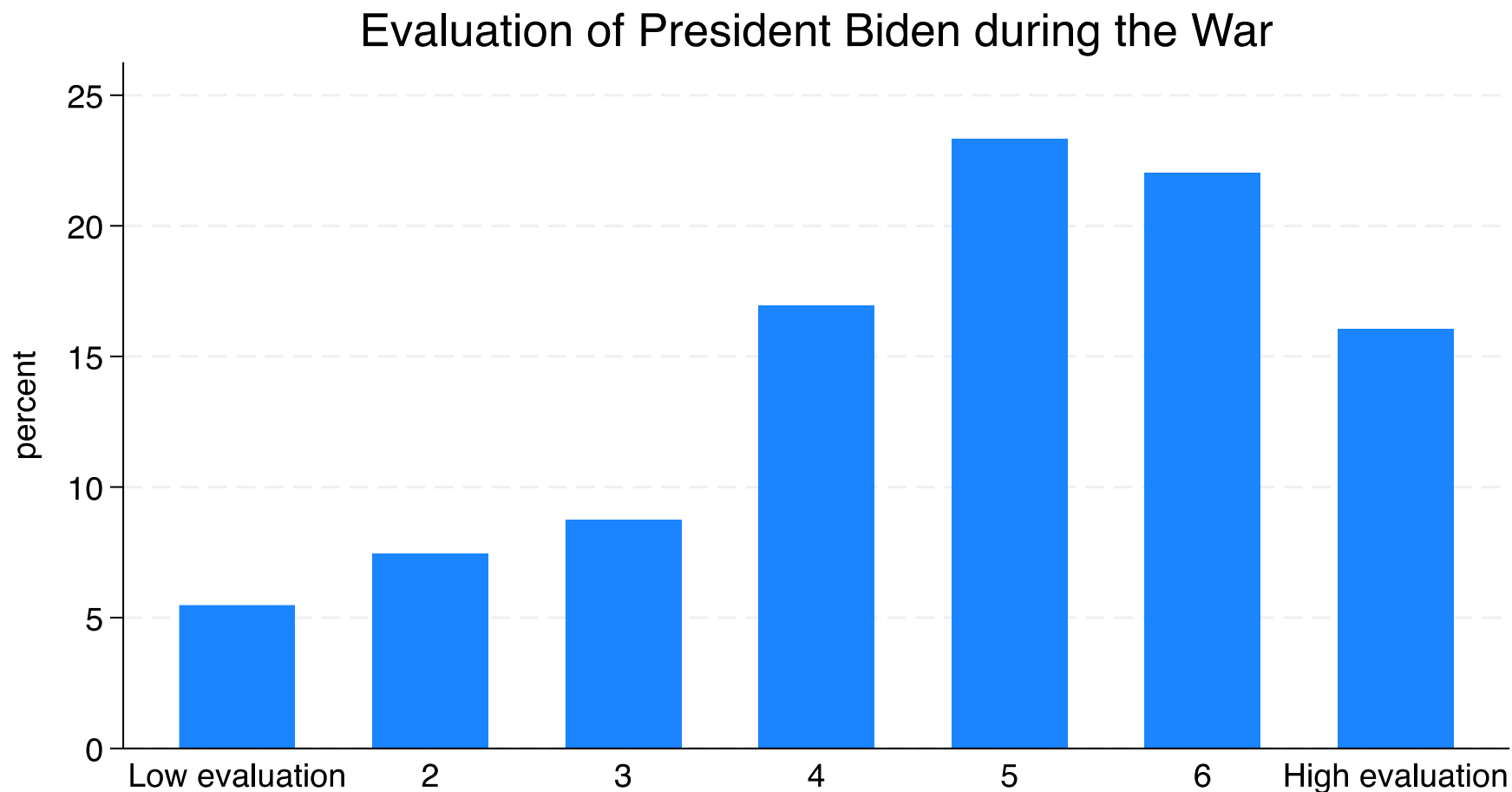

A significant partisan (political camp) gap in support for Biden – voters for Center-Left parties (opposition) are more supportive than voters for Right parties (Coalition)

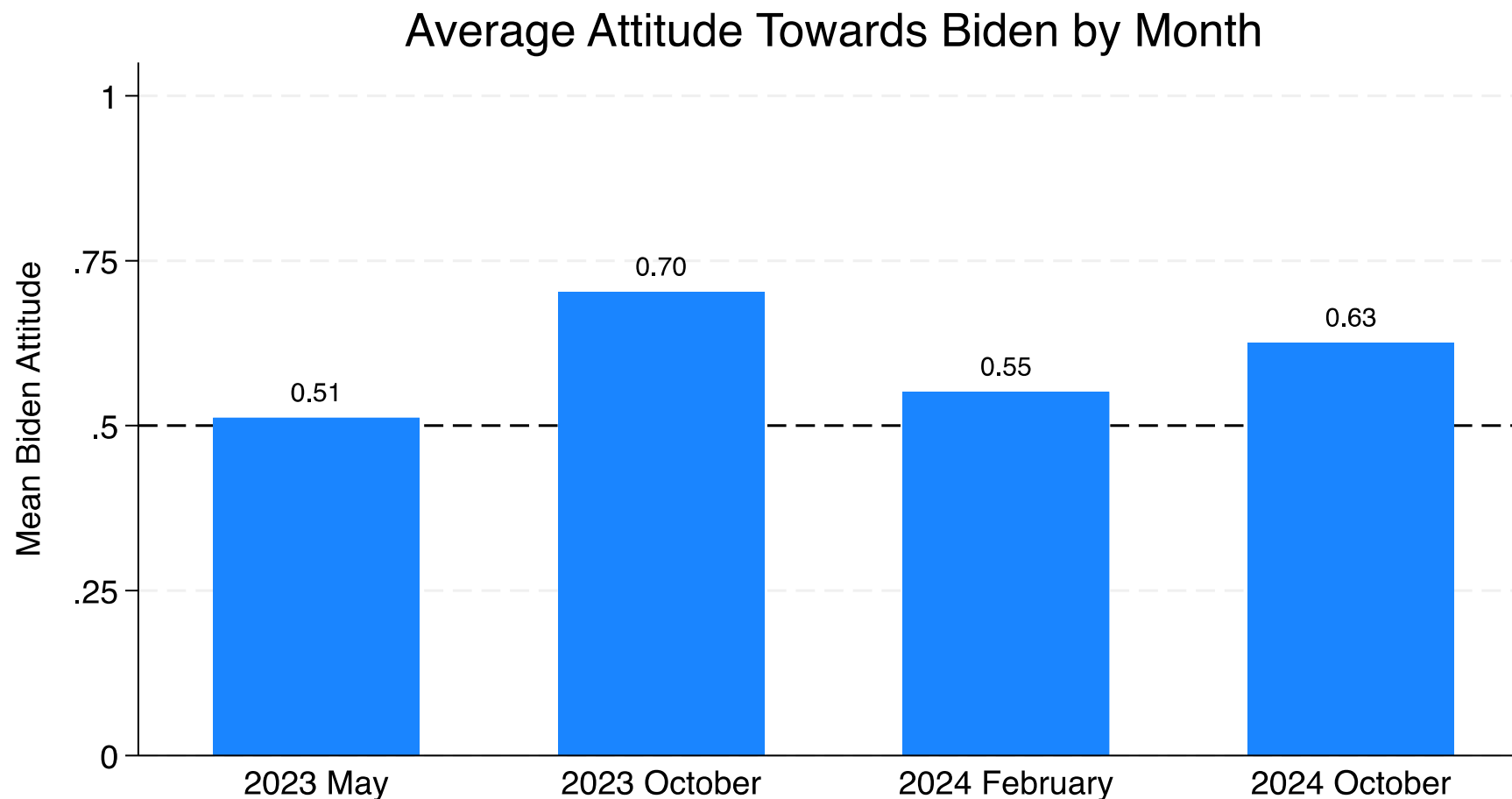
A year after October 7, Israelis are now viewing Biden in more positive terms

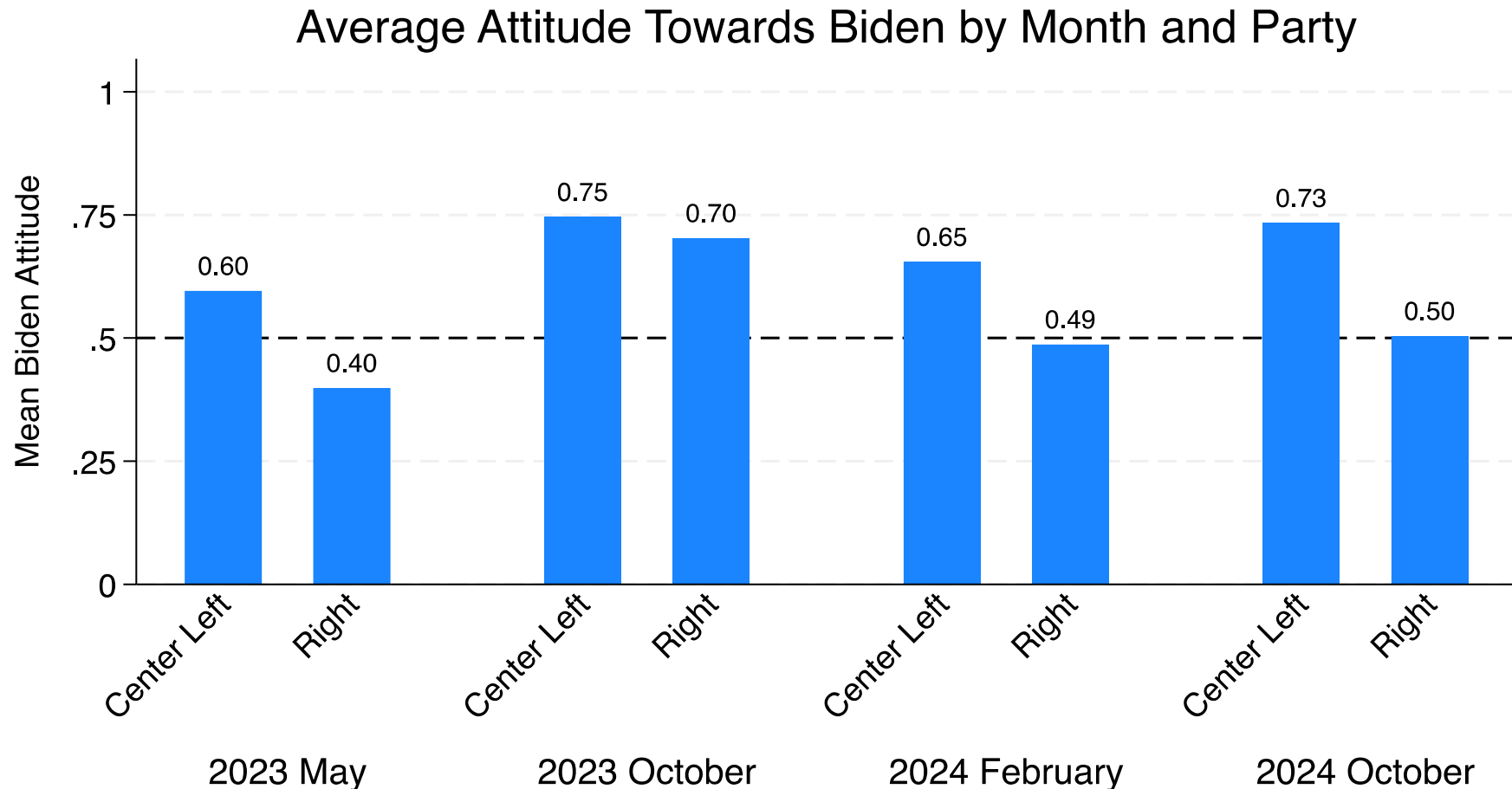
A year after October 7, Israelis are now viewing Biden in more positive terms

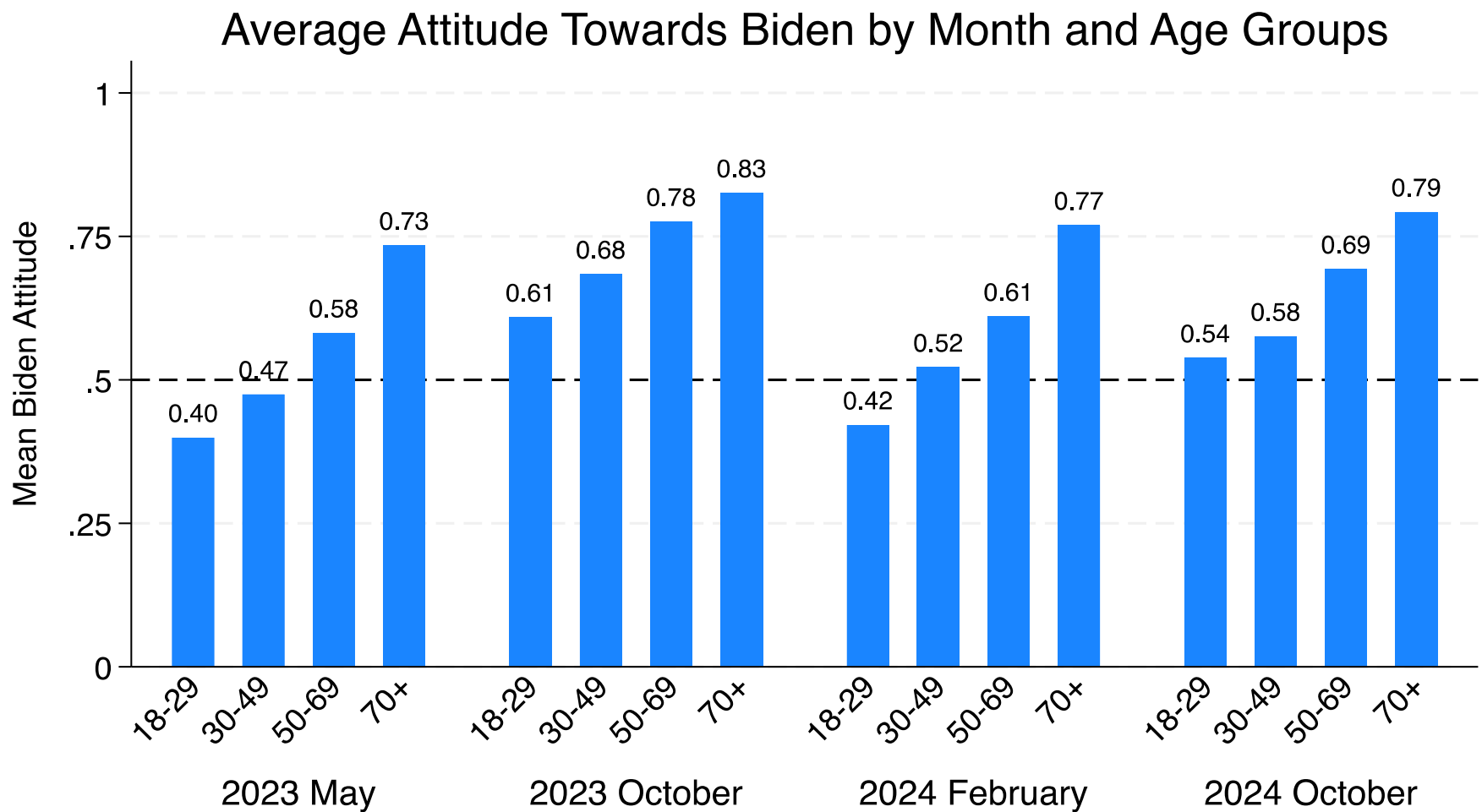
And yet, the partisan divide remains (and increased) – Israelis are strongly divided by party affiliation in their support for Biden

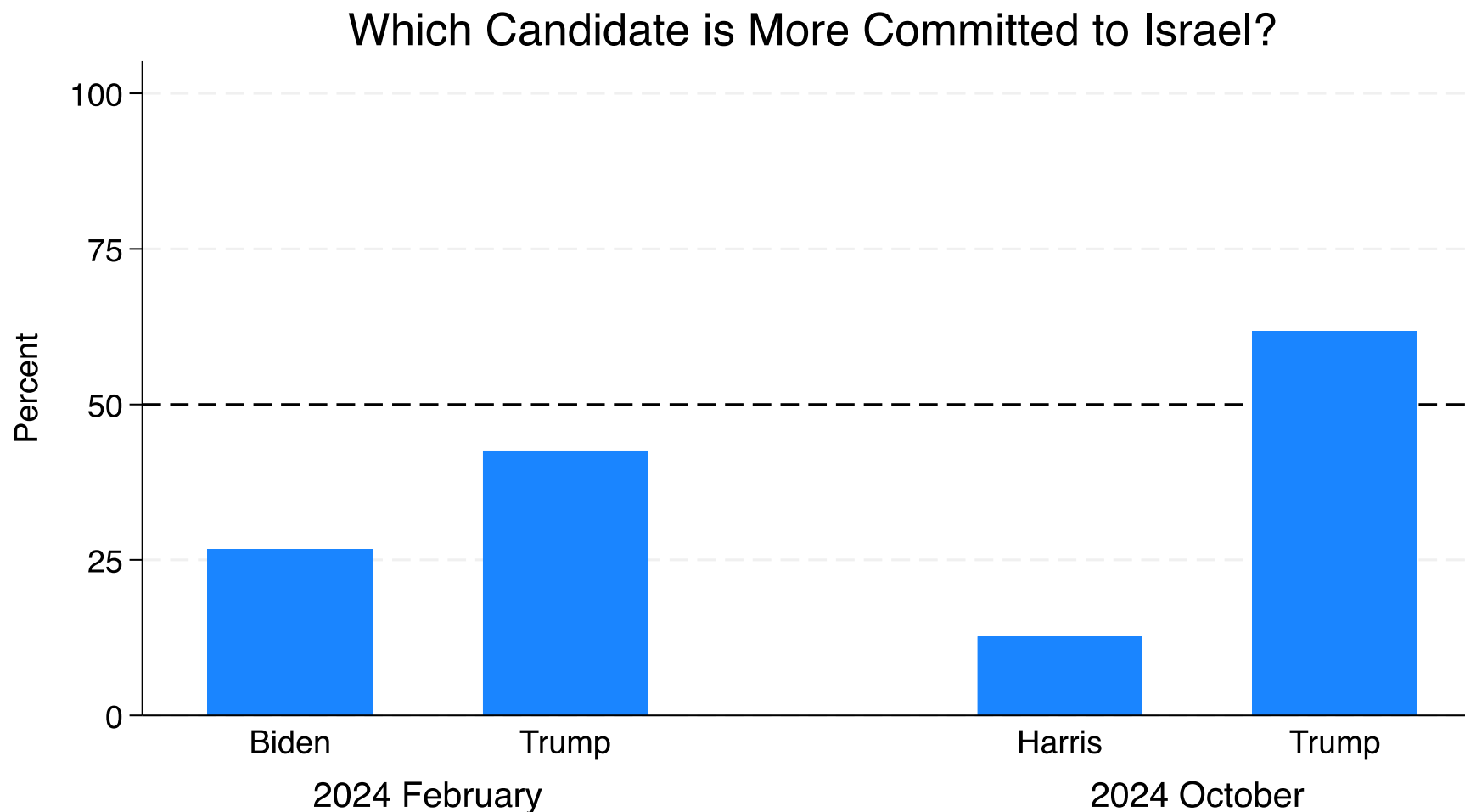

Age is a significant factor in support for Biden – The older you are, the more supportive you are of Biden



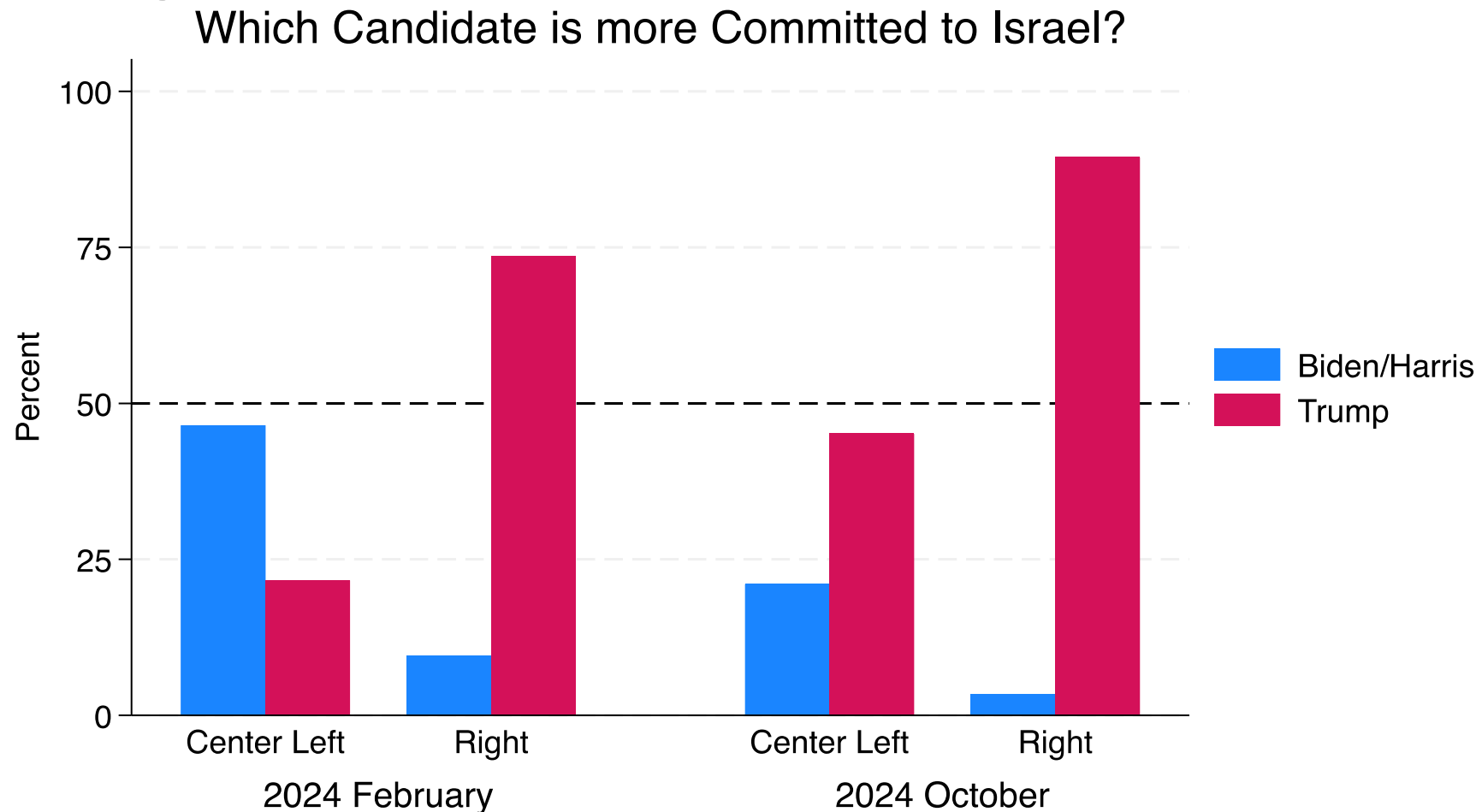

Israelis believe that Trump is more committed to Israel than Biden or Harris, but the gap is much stronger today (in reference to Harris)



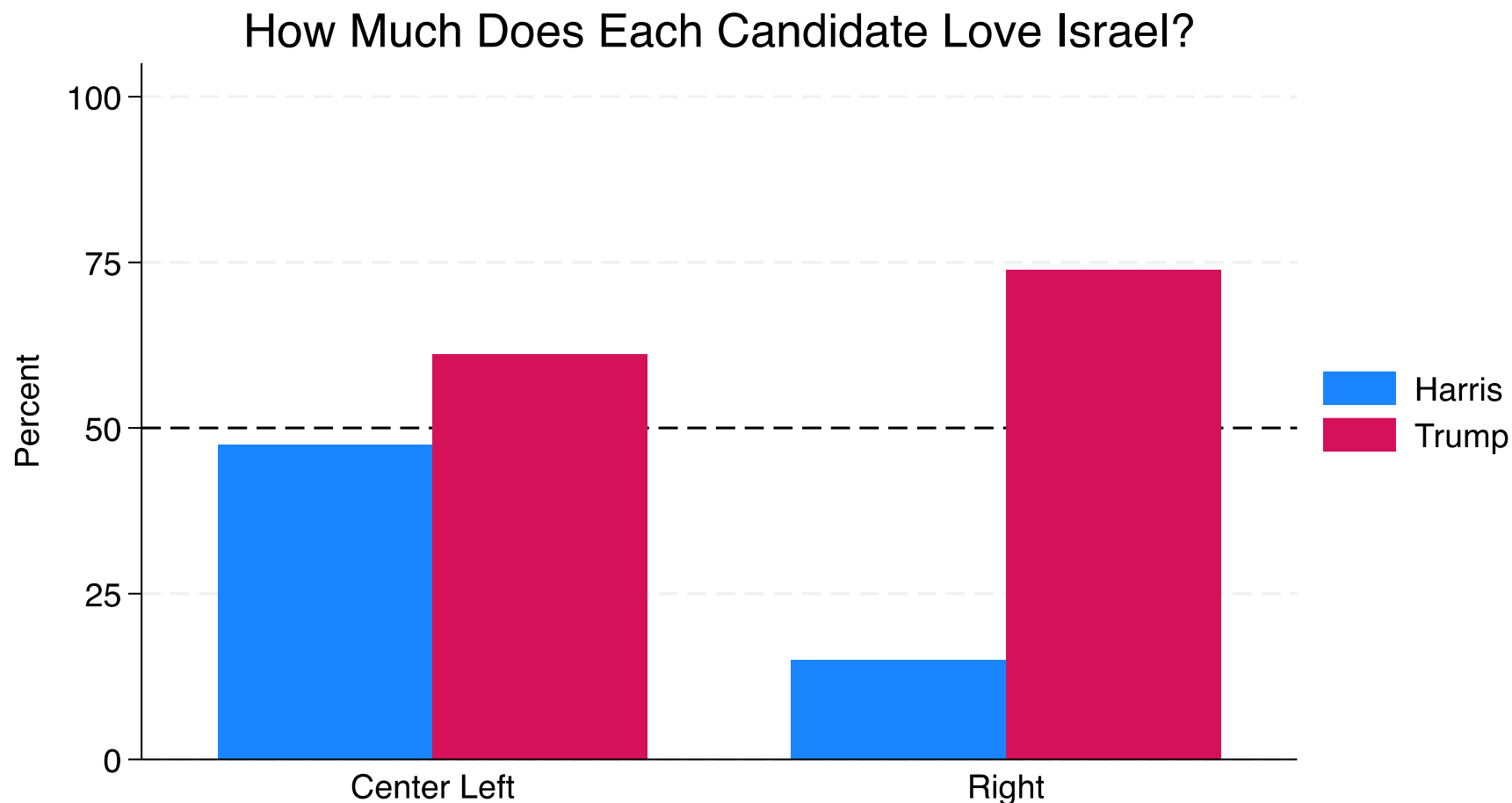

Both partisan groups believe that Trump is more committed to Israel than Harris, but the difference is stronger among voters of Right parties

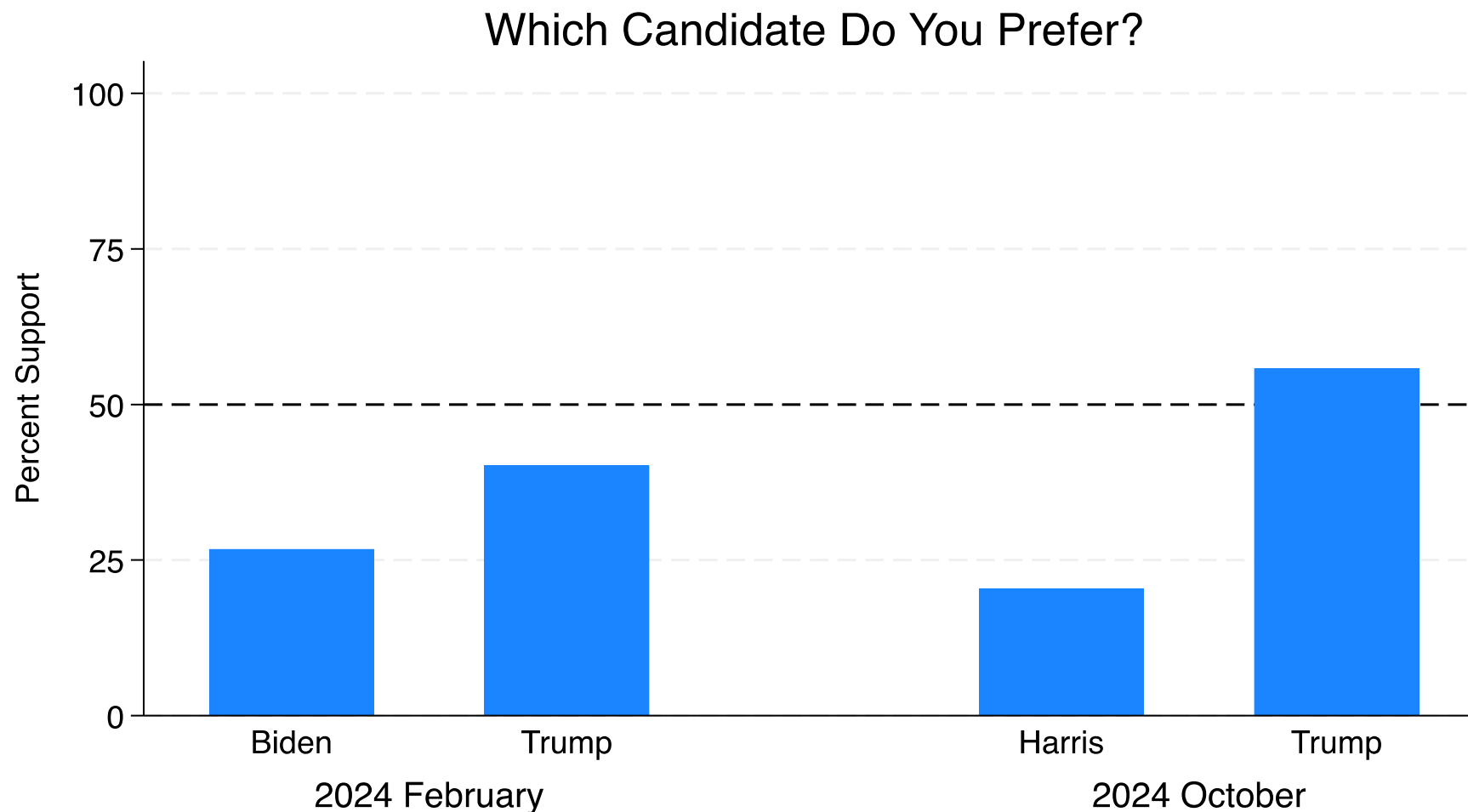
Israelis, across political camps, feel that Trump has a more positive view of Israel than Harris

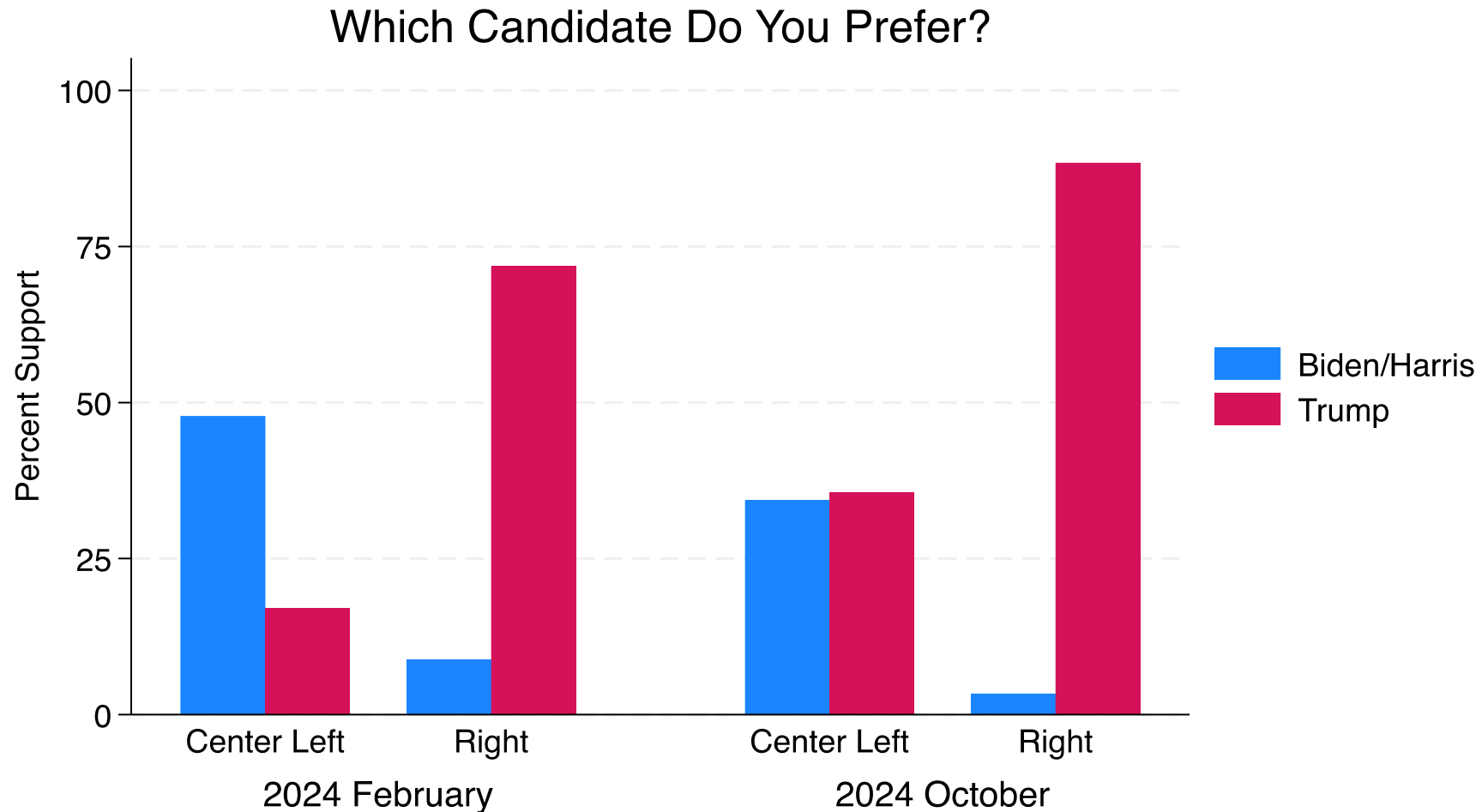

Israelis prefer Trump over Harris by a large margin (and preferred Trump over Biden)



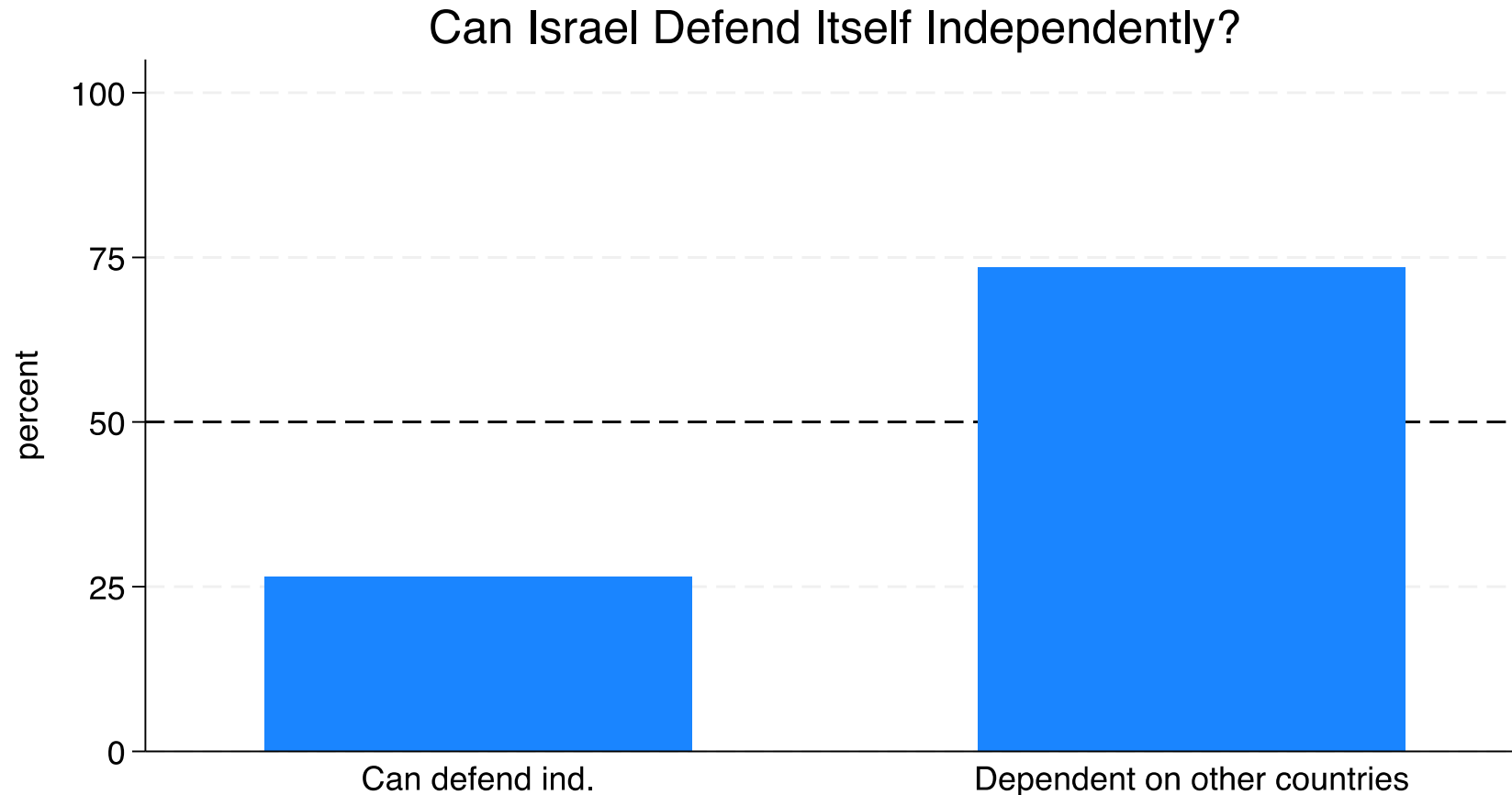

Preference for Trump is significantly stronger among voters for Right parties, while voters for Center-Left parties are evenly split in their support.
