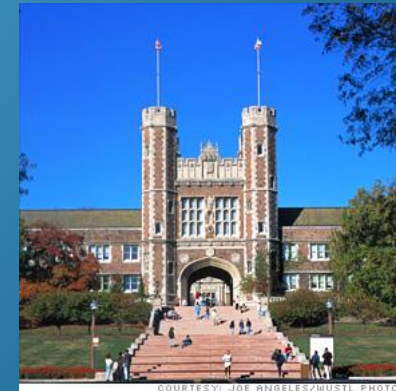


Outgoing Student Exchange Program: Information Session 2025-2026



Why Study Abroad?

- Learn about different cultures and languages first-hand.
- Prepare yourself for work in an increasingly diverse and international workplace.
- Enhance the value of your degree.
- Expose yourself to new perspectives on international issues.
- Gain confidence in yourself, personally and professionally.
- Develop skills and gain experiences that a classroom will never provide.
- Make friends from around the world.
- Understand more in-depth world issues and multicultural perspectives.



Target Audience:



- Strong academic standing with compelling reasons to study abroad.
- Representatives of RU & Israel abroad.
- Good academic standing - no previous disciplinary issues.
- Enrolled in RU as a full-time student (either Israeli or RRIS).
- Exempt from the English course at RU or completed **Advanced B in English**.

Timing:

- RU students can only go on exchange during **Fall Semester**.
- The academic semester begins in some universities during August, for others September or October.
- Make sure to check the academic calendar of each individual university!
- Those students studying abroad as an **extra semester** will still be eligible to graduate on time and participate in the graduation ceremony.



Tuition & Fees:

Tuition payment at partner institutions is waived for RU exchange students.

- Students are responsible for:
 - Flight
 - Medical & travel insurance
 - Visa
 - Housing/accommodations
 - Personal Travel
 - Books
 - All other misc. costs (i.e., “Study Abroad Fee”) while abroad



**** It is the student's responsibility to research the various fees at the partner institutions.**

Coursework:



- Students can enroll for credit in courses available for exchange students, subject to prerequisites, capacity limitations and availability.
- RU students will get full credit for all courses they complete successfully, subject to their academic advisor's approval.
- For students who have completed their third year, the program is intended to provide additional enrichment beyond your degree and the choice of courses is more of a benefit to your specific field of study (subject to advisor approval).

Application materials must be in **English**:

- Application (completed & signed)
- Updated C.V.
- Official copy of your transcript in English!
- Essay – questions
- Proof of completing Advanced English B or an Exemption
- Recommendation letter(s) may be in **Hebrew** or English (academic and/or professional) - optional

How to research the list of partner universities to decide which three to select?

- Go to the partner table at: [Partner Table](#)
- Read the page thoroughly.
- Scroll to the bottom and read carefully the links under “**Partner Information**”.
- In most cases, the best way to learn in depth about a university is to read their **factsheet**.
- Create a chart with the “**positives**” and “**negatives**” of each location to narrow it down to a list of 3 universities.
- You can only get accepted to one university!

Scholarships and Erasmus+



- Reichman University has partnered with some European Universities through the Erasmus+ program for student exchange.
- The European university allocates scholarships for Reichman students to help support their living and travel expenses (approx. 800 Euro multiplied by the number of months in a semester + travel expenses of approx. 360 Euro).
- The updated list of Erasmus+ partners can be found in the partners' table.
- In some institutions, the number of available scholarships may be lower than the total spots offered. In such cases, the RU Scholarship Unit will make decisions based on financial criteria.
- The partner university will provide the student with both the scholarship details and the funds. The funds will only be granted upon the student's arrival at the host university.



Some Partner Institutions:

Singapore Management University (SMU)

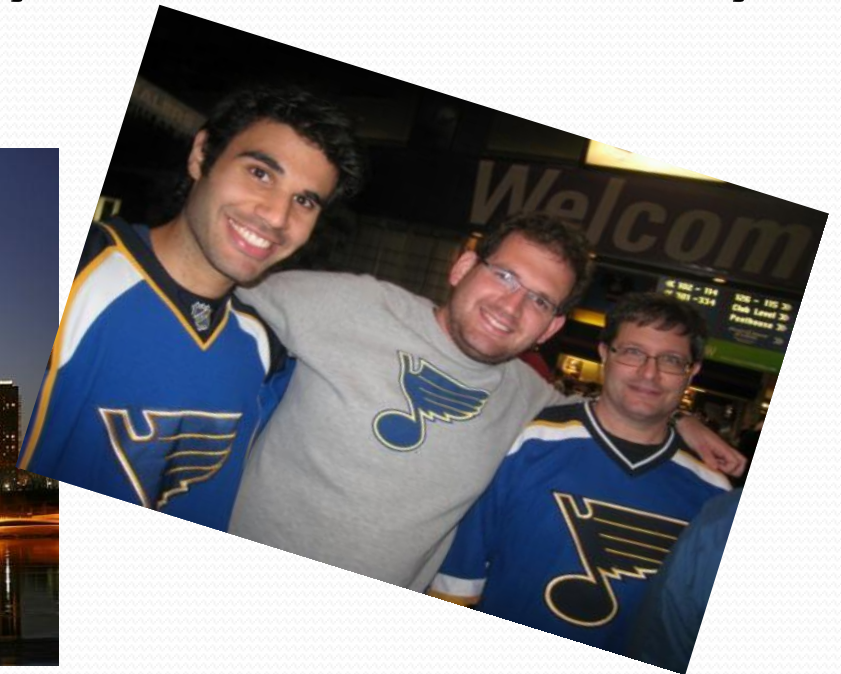
- Located in the heart of downtown Singapore.
- SMU enjoys strategic linkages with business, government and the wider community.
- SMU has a vibrant campus life with many activities for students.
- Students should budget approximately S\$8,000-S\$10,000 per term (including rental of housing).



Washington University in St. Louis



- Located in St. Louis, MO
- One of the top business programs in the USA
- Friendly student campus
- Strong ties with Israel, Jewish Community, and Reichman University.



CEU, San Pablo Madrid

- Located in Madrid, Spain.
- The University has two large & modern campuses, one near the city center and another in a more suburban area.
- CEU Offers advanced facilities, research centers, and a global, innovative learning environment.
- Courses in the English Language are offered in many fields of study.



Università Commerciale Luigi Bocconi

- Located in Milan, Italy
- Founded in 1902
- Bocconi University is internationally recognized as a leader in the fields of Economics and Business.
- There are more than 1200 exchanges every year between Bocconi and 200 partner universities worldwide.
- Exchange students can apply for accommodation in Bocconi Residence Halls through the ISD Housing Office, but housing is not guaranteed.

Sciences Po



- Located in Paris, France
- Established in 1842
- Traditional university of French elite. Alumni include:
 - 13 French Prime Ministers
 - 10 Presidents/PM's of other countries
 - 6 CEOs of France's 40 Largest companies
- Many courses in English and a large cohort of exchange students
- Important: No Dorms available



LUISS Guido Carli University



- Located in Rome, Italy
- Ranked 3rd in Italian University Rankings
- Small, private university (around 6,200 students)
- Most international students live in private apartments with Italian or international roommates near the university
- Many degree programs in English



Stockholm School of Economics (SSE)



- Located in Stockholm, Sweden
- A private business school founded in 1909
- Ranked as the best business school in the Nordic and Baltic countries.
- A very livable city: a broad range of recreational activities, entertainment, and a very welcoming society.



Masaryk University



- Located in Brno, Czech Republic
- Student friendly city and excellent campus life
- Excellent public transportation, very close to Vienna
- Many Israelis!





- ▶ To apply for the exchange program at Reichman, you **first must submit the online application on our website**. Please refrain from contacting the host institution until you have been accepted for exchange at RU and been given a 'green light' by us.

- ▶ **Things to consider:**

- **Cost:** Even though you are paying tuition directly to RU, you are responsible for the cost of food, travel, accommodations, insurance, and all other fees associated with living abroad.
- **Housing:** On-campus housing is available at some institutions at an additional cost; at others, students are responsible for finding their own accommodations.
- **Courses:** Courses must be approved by your academic advisor and coordinator at RU.
- **Language:** Consider how easy/hard it will be to get around without knowing the host language.
- **Consider your mental preparedness for life in another country.** While studying abroad may be the experience of a lifetime, keep in mind that living in another country is very different from travelling in it. This is not a weekend vacation; things are different than what you are used to at home.
